

In 1996 the group stayed in the parking lot at Bear Valley Cross Country cooking hot dogs and letting the kids get pulled around by our dogs. The next day was beautiful. Other years we had to un burry our gear on the second day and two years we have high tailed it out to beat a storm on Sunday.

This was quite a year though. In January we left early on Sunday because of a big storm and In February races were cancelled because of LACK of snow...and warm weather. We scheduled SnoBASH 2 earlier than usual because Easter is so late all feared there would be no snow at the end of April...... 



For those that have AKC registered Siberian Huskies, Alaskan Malamutes and Samoyeds, they will enter confirmation.

All of those that look purebred Siberian, Malamute or Samoyed that have been rescued or acquired without papers but have been altered, can enter Conformation Spay/neuter for that breed.

All of those that have taken our wonderful mixes....enter Sled Dog- Sib, Sammy, Mal, and all those in between can enter Sled Dog.

There are classes for puppies, adults, veterans and champions. We will be happy to help you with which to enter.

You don't have to know what you are doing, nor does your dog. This is an event that is meant to be fun and expose all of us to having more fun.
