They have single rooms and out buildings for families. If you are only parking for the day they do charge a fee to stay the day. For those that want dogs in their room or can't drop off the car, there are places to stay in Arnold and Angels camp. Which are 30-45 minutes drives from where we are.

SnoBASH ~ running your dogs

Heron has offered to manage rides at SnoBASH. She can be emailed at snowlets8@yahoo.com

She will address issues during orientation. Attendance at orientation is MANDATORY.

At orientation, she will teach people how to put on harness, explain what the terminology that is used means so if someone says "unhook black dog from tug line" people will understand what the tug line is. She will also explain how things could get when the dogs start to go so if someone shouts "move!" Or "grab the dog" people will jump in and not just stand and stare (you know that look lol).

There is a process of putting dogs on and off that needs to be followed. Front dogs are first on but last off when we return.

The fee will be \$20 per dog payable on the day. Cash please.

All equipment will be supplied for running the dogs, however please bring your own water, water bowls and food for the dog.

We will have collars and harnesses available.

You are responsible for all of your belongings so please keep track of it, things can get lost in snow easily.

Everybody must check in with Heron, if you are not checked in by 11:30, your dog won't be able to run.

All dogs must be in harness and on the tie out after orientation if they want to run. If you wander off with your dogs when we are putting dogs in their teams, we will not wait for you. And you'll have to wait for the next run.

Stay off the sled trails unless you are assisting.

Children are welcome to attend however please do not leave children unattended and under NO circumstances can a child approach a dog without their parent or guardian with them.

If you have a dog that do not like to be handled by strangers please tie a yellow ribbon to its collar so we'll know to call for the owner if any handling is needed.

All times are approximates and are subject to change.

Check in 10:45

Orientation starts at 11am.

Run the dogs from 12pm-4pm

There will be a group dinner at the Tamarack lodge at 6pm please RSVP if you'd like to go. Dogs are not allowed in the lodge.

Easter Dog Treats {Vegan}

Ingredients

- 2 c Flour (you could use a whole wheat or other flour, but it will alter the color slightly. Whole wheat also give them more body. I really don't think the dogs will mind •
- 1/8 tsp Baking soda
- 2 mashed, very ripe Bananas
- 2 Tbl Unsweetened Applesauce
- 2 Tbl Warm water
- All natural food coloring

Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
- 2. Combine all ingredients except food color in the bowl of an electric mixer. Blend to form a dough that will hold together in a ball. If your dough is too moist, add more flour. Too dry? Try adding more applesauce. The dough is very forgiving.
- 3. Roll the dough to about 1/4". They will puff up when baked.
- 4. Cut into shapes using miniature Easter shaped cookie cutters. These are about 1-1/2" cutters. You can get these on Amazon.com or at most craft stores that carry baking supplies. I think even Walmart might carry them in this small size.
- 5. You can also get the bags there as well.
- 6. Arrange cookies on a parchment or Silpat lined cookie sheet.
- 7. Bake for 5-6 minutes until they are just set and move easily on the cookie sheet. Do not let them brown.
- 8. Reduce the heat of the oven and once it's at the lowest setting (175 degrees), continue to bake until completely dry. We are basically dehydrating the cooking removing all of the moisture so they are crunchy and have some shelf-stability. Any moisture that remains could cause them to mold after a few days. If you are unsure, take one of the thickest cookies and snap it in half to test. I usually turn the oven off at this point and let them cool in the dry residual oven heat overnight.
- 9. Allow to cool completely before giving to your pup!
