Planet K-9 Cookies

One 6-ounce jar of baby food (meat flavor) Six tablespoons of wheat germ

Four tablespoons of powdered milk

One teaspoon of dried parsley

Mix all ingredients in a medium-size bowl. Form the mixture into eight ovals the size of a tablespoon. Bake the cookies on a greased cookie sheet for 15 minutes in a 350-degree oven. Cool cookies for 30 minutes. Recipe can be doubled or tripled.

Archie Squares

2 1/2 cups whole wheat flour
1/2 cup powdered dry milk
1/2 tsp. garlic powder
1 tsp. brown sugar or honey
6 tbs. meat or bacon drippings, cold right from refrigerator, not melted or soft!
1 egg, slightly beaten
1/2 cup Ice water

Preheat oven to 350F. Lightly oil a cookie sheet. Combine flour, dry milk, garlic powder and sugar. Cut in meat drippings until mixture resembles corn meal. Mix in egg. Add enough water so that mixture forms a ball. Using your fingers, pat out dough onto cookie sheet to 1/2" thick. Cut dough into squares appropriate for your dog size. Prick each cookie with fork. Bake 25-30 minutes. Remove from tray and cool on rack. Store in airtight container. -- Bullwrinkle.com

We have two projects for this year. The first Is to make "grocery" bags for the Siberian Nationals Rescue Parade. The second to make booties for ourselves.



For the past 4 years Marie and and I have made items for and helped with the National Rescue Parade. At the Siberian Nationals they recognize the Siberians that have been rescued and their owners. They are given a bag of goodies and a beautiful ribbon. This year we would like to make "grocery" bags to hold the goodies. A special material with a paw/hand on it was donated. They are easy to make. We need between 20 and 30. It will be similar to the bag here.

In the past 8 years BASH has made 1000 + dog booties for use by

Iditarod Musher for a group called the Bootie Brigade. It appears that that group is defunct but a group of us were talking that we still need to make booties for our own dogs. We have a blast with 5-9 sewing machines going at one time. you don't sew there are still jobs to do- turning and quality checking of our sewing, trimming threads. If you want to



learn to use a sewing machine, we will be happy to teach you. This is for women, men and the kids.

We plan on making bags at the first meeting, finishing any that need to be done at the

second along with making booties for our dogs.

We have a MULE now for carting and bathroom runs. This will be the first camping trip of the summer. We have to pull out all the stuff we put away for the winter (BBQ, tables, etc)
