

Sunday's Husky Hike at Santa Cruz Lighthouse Field/Its Beach was a pleasure, according to all who came. Although the Wharf to Wharf Run from Santa Cruz to Capitola delayed traffic into town a bit, all the crowds were well south of us, and the It's Beach area was un-crowded, pleasant, and we had no parking problems! There is a lot to be said in favor of early morning outings-- the only way to beat the increasingly heavy weekend traffic here.

Weather was perfect, bright and warm through the major part of town, but with typical cooling beach overcast near the surf. Jim, Nichole, Brian, Karen, Gabriel, Dennis and I were the happy human visitors; our faithful canine companions Kaiya, Malachai, Captain Jack, Freya, and good ol' Kai along for the day – a good number of other dogs were enjoying the day as well, sharing the beach with an all-sorts mix of dog breeds and people. Some surfers with board walked through on their way out to sit amongst the small rollers that came through occasionally, but the surf scene was really pretty quiet.

It was a relaxed and mellow scene, no dog to dog incidents of any note. Minimal wind, tide was moderate so the beach was a little smaller than expected, but there was plenty of room to roam, frolic in the surf, and nose around in small bits of vegetation. Since we were there early in the day, beach authorities may have been away at the Wharf Run venues and there wasn't much of a crowd there wasn't active enforcement of leash regulations.

Gabriel certainly seemed to enjoy the day – he headed directly to the beach to 'see the whales' he said, as soon as he stepped out of his family's car. Later, he honed his considerable cliff scaling skills along the bluff (his attentive father waiting below to catch him should a slip occur) and his mother wondering just how well her little guy really could balance at the edge of the cliff once he made it to the top. Hope those photos came out and we can post them!

Dennis, Jim, and Nicole took off with the dogs on a pleasant expedition along the Cliff street trail that skirts all along the bluffs up to Natural Bridges State Park, enjoying the walk and the exceptional vistas. I relaxed on the beach with my crochet, visited with Karen, and later Nicole, and thoroughly enjoyed people and dog watching, sail boats, and even some container ships way out to sea. Lovely, classic surf, sand, and sea vistas. I didn't see any whales, however, and there weren't any tide pools here to investigate.
