

HUSKY HIKES

Return to Stulsaft Park: This Time, the Southwest Entrance Goodwin Avenue and Mitchell way, Redwood City, CA 94061

On Sunday, November 13 we took another Husky Hike to Stulsaft Park in Redwood City. We had last visited there April 10, a half a year ago, with warm spring conditions —we were really lucky to enjoy this again on brilliant sunny fall day. Candice and Stella, Gail and Kaila, David and Avalanche, and Dennis and Kai were the happy Husky Hikers this trip.

We met at the bottom corner of the park near Goodwin Avenue & Mitchell Way this time, where there are a few convenient picnic tables and benches, water fountains, and the unleashed area begins. The parking in this residential area is easy and plentiful, at least this early morning Sunday. While we enjoyed coffee and breakfast bites, the dogs ran around joyously off leash, barreling up and down the gully under the oaks, providing spectacle and comedy while we people conversed and caught up. Pretty soon, the dogs were hauling their people up the path for the longer tour of the dog trails.

I stayed behind at the table to finish the wonderful soft and sweet and fully ripe Persimmon that Gail had brought, guard the remaining snacks, and enjoy the truly sublime atmosphere for a little while. The sunshine slanted into the table area, a bit of dew in the air after the rain, no wind, just fall freshness and peace. Pretty soon, though, more people and their dogs arrived -- all I saw were well behaved, very friendly, and fun to meet and talk to. It was never very crowded, people tended to head up the paths and out of the bench area pretty quickly. After a while, two familiar looking Huskies shot down the path on their own – my own Kai, coming to check on me, and Stella, who proceeded at great speed down to the water in the gulch where she obviously enjoyed being off leash. Pretty soon the rest of the group arrived, relieved to find the errant pair. We visited and snacked some more, and then packed up and left early enough to get home for afternoon football. Everyone said they were so glad that they had come!

Stulsaft Park is close in to those on the peninsula, easily accessible from both Farm Hill Road (upper main entrance) and Woodside Road (lower dog park entrance.) Highly recommend this park because of the shady tree cover of most of the wide paths, the forest like atmosphere, and the facilities. It can be just a short jaunt through the trees, or a day long excursion. You can get more information about the park in the March/April Siberian Husky newletters from earlier this year.

I had sent out e-mail invitations and driving directions for this month's hike on the BASH and BASHRR mail distribution server the week before we went, as we had not firmed up a date in time for the Siberian Tales newsletter publication deadline. Weather (rain) and our own plans were too uncertain. I think that will be again the case for our next Husky Hike, which will be sometime early December, most probably at Pioneer/Dry Creek East Bay Regional Park off May Road in Union City.

Doggy-noggy recipe

Traditional eggnog isn't safe for dogs, but with some clever changes, they can enjoy this holiday treat alongside you.

- 16 ounces of plain, organic yogurt (low fat)
- 1 chicken breast (boiled, unseasoned)
- 1/4 cup of green beans
- 1/4 cup of carrots
- 1/2 cup sweet potatoes (steamed) or pumpkin puree (plain)
- 1 egg
- 1 1/2 cups water

Put everything in a blender or food processor and blend until it's completely smooth and frothy. Then pour into bowls and serve!

Gingerbread Dog Cookies

- 3 cups whole wheat flour
- 1 1/2 tbsp ground ginger
- 3/4 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp ground cloves
- 1/2 cup molasses
- 1/2 cup water
- 1/4 cup canola oil
- 1. Preheat your oven to 325° F.
- 2. Mix flour, ginger, cinnamon, and cloves together. In a separate bowl, combine the molasses, water, and oil.

- 3. Pour the molasses mix into the flour, and stir until well combined.
- 4. On a lightly floured surface, roll out the dough until it's about 1/2 inch thick.
- 5. Cut the dough into holiday or dog-related shapes using cookie cutters.
- 6. Use non-stick cooking spray to lightly cover a baking sheet.
- 7. Put your cut-out dough on the sheet, spacing cookies about 1/2 inch apart.
- 8. Let them bake 20 minutes, then cool them on a wire rack and serve!
