We would like to thank all the people who voted for Tehya and Faith in the Kuranda Dog Of The Week contest. With the win Kuranda donated a bed to BASH rescue.

For those of you that do not know about Kuranda beds, they are great! The beds are lightweight and very durable. The beds come in different sizes and choices of material types. We ended up using the heavy nylon material, after Faith ate two beds up when she was a puppy. This material seems to last pretty well.

We first heard of these beds from Randee, since we were looking for a raised bed for our older dog Kaianne. Kaianne was getting more fragile and we wanted to get a bed she could not get hurt on. These beds have no open area around the legs, so there is no way a dog could step and get a leg caught. The beds keep the dogs off of the cold and damp ground in the winter and let air circulate underneath in the summer. There is also an optional pad you can get to put on the bed if you want to spoil them even more.

We would say these beds are well worth looking into, we have had very good luck with them. Our dogs each have one, but they seem to both end up on one bed together. Thanks again for all your votes. I hope you look into these beds.....Wayne, Cheryl, Tehya and Faith Jueal

Valentine Treats for Dogs

Homemade Doggie-licious Carob Treats

Ingredients:

1 cup peanut butter

2 eggs, slightly beaten

1 cup milk

2 cups whole wheat flour

2 tbsp. sugar

1 tbsp. baking powder

1 cup carob chips

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.
- 2. Beat eggs with peanut butter, then add milk and combine well.
- 3. In separate bowl, combine flour, sugar, and baking powder.
- 4. Combine the dry mixture with the peanut butter mixture. Mix well.
- 5. Stir in carob chips.
- 6. Drop by rounded teaspoons onto lightly greased cookie sheet, leaving about 1" in between cookies.
- 7. Bake for 20 to 25 minutes, or until biscuits look just barely "dry" in the middle and are baked through. Do not overbake! The biscuits will naturally harden as they cool.
- 8. Let cool before removing from cookie sheet.
- 9. Call your dog over for a tasty homemade treat!

Liver Cornbread Dog Treats

Ingredients: a box of cornbread mix, 1 lb of pureed beef liver, 1 clove of garlic, 1 whole egg (beaten).

To make: use the pureed beef liver in place of the milk for the cornbread mix. Add chopped garlic and mix in the egg. Spread into a lightly greased shallow pan or cookie sheet and bake according to package directions - However, watch carefully as it will likely take less time to bake. Cool the treats before breaking or cutting into pieces.

Variations: you can substitute chicken livers, ground chicken, or ground turkey in place of the beef liver if you prefer. If you don't have ready access to cornbread mix, substitute 1 cup of whole wheat flour, 1 cup of cornmeal, and 1 tbsp of oil. Bake for around 20-25 minutes at 350 degrees F.

Potato dog treats are a favorite of many canines. And even better, making these delicious gourmet treats is pretty easy, even for an amateur baker! A really easy treat (to be fed in moderation, of course) is to make a "doggy cake" of 1 lb of ground beef, about a cup of oatmeal, enough eggs to hold it together (usually around 5 or 6 large fresh eggs), and some chopped veggies. Mix it all together and bake until it's set... and then "frost" it with mashed potatoes.

Check out another one of many recipes below for simple homemade potato dog treats.

*** Never feed your dog potato leaves or stems, and cut away any green spots or growths/sprouts on the potato prior to using it. These can contain toxins that are harmful to dogs.

Homemade Potato Balls for Dogs

Ingredients:

1 cups mashed potatoes

1 medium shredded carrot

1 egg yolk

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees F.
- 2. With a fork, combine the mashed potatoes and shredded. Mix in egg yolk.
- 3. Form the potato mixture into about 2 dozen miniature balls.
- 4. Place potato balls on lightly greased cookie sheet and bake for 10-15 minutes, or until lightly browned.
- 5. Let cool fully... then let your dog enjoy!


