We had a fantastic time and all the dogs ran so great, it was something to see. We think that all of the "newbie" owners were able to ride on one of the ATV's if they wanted to. That was hard to do. The mule was full of people so they could watch their dog's experience carting. Everyone that knew how to do things such as harness and make sure Alaskan collars were on did, watering all the dogs, getting more drops out, cooking and more.....it was what BASH is about. Everyone working together.

We had the smallest ATV with 6, the next two had 9 each and the biggest had 10 dogs. Usually when we start out with new dogs there is a little shuffling around in the first 100 yards that takes experience so we are very careful. They all did so good that we took off and all ran and ran well. We only had to take one dog off during the run (he was new and out of shape) so he got a rid back on the mule.
