Coal Creek Open Space Preserve/Russia Ridge Preserve

Lots of people expressed an interest in hiking with their dogs. So Kim Flores and I have worked out a plan to start. The first walk will be Sat, Feb 8th....we will go the Coal Creek Open Space Preserve/Russian Ridge Preserve. this is up near Redwood City, so a bit of a drive for some of us. we would like to meet at the parking lot for the Russian Ridge Preserve (the 2 preserves are next to each other and the entrances are close) around 9:30am. everyone should bring water for themselves and their dogs, plus snacks/treats, if you want. And be dressed for walking....comfortable shoes, etc. From The San Jose area, you should take Saratoga Ave, which turns into Skyline Blvd/CA 35. You stay on Skyline Blvd until you go past Alpine Rd by 0.4 mi. There is a Caltrans vista point pullout area on Skyline Blvd (opposite Russian Ridge Preserve gate RR01, approx 1.2 mi past Page Mill Rd, and you can access Coal Creek Preserve from there. (I have to say I am terrible on dir! ections so it might be wise for all of you to do a mapquest direction search.). Please let me know if you will be hiking with us. Hope to see you there.

#### Yukon Quest News

#### **Current Race Conditions**

Sunday, January 26, 2014

The warming trend over the last ten days has obviously had an impact on the trail conditions throughout Alaska and the Yukon. Most of us need only look to our back yard to see this. Consequently, our trail teams on both sides of the border have remained in the field for an extended time. I expect the Alaska team to be back in town by tomorrow night, Sunday the 26th. Expect a detailed report after that.

A few things to keep in mind for the coming week as the temperatures continue to fluctuate:

- -There have been absolutely no discussions to cancel or delay the race. Nor are any planned. The race will start on February 1st.
- -As conditions warrant, the start location could possibly be moved or modified.
- -As conditions warrant, the trail may be re-routed. This is nothing new and has happened several times over the years. We will give you as much prior notice as possible if this occurs.
- -Conditions are changing daily, we will adapt as necessary.

The organization is fully aware of the concerns all interested parties have regarding the rapidly changing conditions. It is difficult to remain patient in times like this, but please be assured that we are utilizing all of our assets to plan for any given contingencies.

#### **Iditarod Weather**

#### Warm weather up north

Weather woes.

Undoubtedly if you are an Iditarod fan, you have noticed the strange weather patterns. While the east is breaking record low temperatures, the north is doing exact the opposite. Ever since the new year arrived a mere 3 weeks ago, the Greatland has experienced a heat wave. Although the term "heat "is used very loosely here. Heat in the Anchorage area means 45 above. Heat in Fairbanks means 35 above. Unfortunately both places also saw some precipitation in the "wrong from "which made for very slick driving and very slick mushing trails.

Long time Iditarod volunteer Mike Webber from Nome is even reporting that it has rained all the way up there and the Runkel family from Nikolai has given it 3 tries to reach Rohn traveling through the farewell burn. On their last trip "the trees were blowing like grass in the wind "and they called it good at their place "Buffalo Camp ". Buffalo Camp is about 40 miles before Nikolai and often used by the mushers as a resting spot. Some years the tents are open, others they are not. But in any case once you reach buffalo camp, typically the bumpiest ride and the hills are behind you. It's a good place to regroup and change runner plastic. Changing runner plastic is something mushers this winter might just have to become more used to than normal, with the snow cover being as scant as it is.

Yet a lot can change between now and Iditarod start which still is 34 days away. But no doubt it has not been the racing season to date, most mushers had hoped for. Last weekends Kusko 300 was close to being a Kusko Swim again. In the end Rohn Buser edged out (or how others put it "dethroned") Jeff King. Both mushers had their own set of "issues" leaving Kalskag. It could have very well been "the King" who took first prize. Both teams had equal traveling speeds. I always very much eye the performance during Kusko. Its kind of a telltale of a kennels training program. The Kusko is as unforgiving as they come. Both mushers finished with nice looking large teams. And teams which have a lot of speed.
