Watch the website...there is 50-55 inches of snow at Bear Valley Cross Country. With El Nino predictions there could be a large amount of snow coming in January and February. If we get too much snow, they may not be able to put in a trail for us. Right now we aren't worried about no snow to sled on. As we get closer we will send out updates.

Over the years we have fewer drops for dogs at the sledding location. We have limited drops that are owned by BASH which means we won't have places as in the past for EVERYONE to drop their dog. You will need to purchase some from Nordkyn.com. We will have limited harnesses and Alaskan collars available to purchase.

We will be renting Tamarack Pines as a group again this year. Rooms range from \$300 to \$500 for the 2 nights. There are 5 rooms. Rooms will be available first to "Core Members" who work much of the event. If we have enough people, we also rent the large room on the first floor. The parking lot is small so you must be able to drop your dogs off your vehicle. There is room to tie off the dogs near the sledding trail but not in the parking area. Bring your tie-outs if you have them. DOGS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED IN THE LODGE/ROOMS DUE TO THE NUMBER OF DOGS WE WILL HAVE!!!!

"209-736-9902" messages "209-753-2310" onsite 209-768-5346 cell BASH has stayed here in the past and recently they again are renting to individuals. NO PETS in rooms. They have single rooms and out buildings for families.

For those that want dogs in their room or can't drop off the car, there are places to stay in Arnold and Angels camp. Which are 30-45 minutes drives from where we are.

SnoBASH etiquette

A long time ago, BASH had drops for up to 100 dogs and a large enough space to set them up and 20 members that helped set up. Now we have about 6-8 members that help set up and maybe 20 drops. This year people will need to bring their own drops (available through Nordkyn.com) or check with others going that you can share their drops. Dogs stay on drops not leashes so that we have less of a chance for a loose dog and avoid dogs that might argue. You can't help with other teams if you are always holding your dog. We will have Alaskan Collars to buy or loan (all dogs must have an Alaskan Collar to sled (no buckle, pinch or chokes allowed) and have SOME harnesses to buy or borrow.

We only take 4-6 dogs out on our sled runs. We HAVE to have at least 2 dogs that have experience and they need to be in the lead. If you want one or two of your dogs run, you will need to help others on their runs also. We don't have many leaders so the last time we ran we had a number of people that are out on our 1 mile trail to help guide or hold teams as needed.

We want people to come and enjoy running their dogs, but plan on helping to accomplish this. Glossary

Drops- (aka Cable pickets) are snaps on 12-16 inch drops off a main cable...can be 2-3-4 or more drops per cable. They are usually attached to two trees (with a second cable). You attach your dogs to these while preparing to sled or eating lunch.

Loves attention, ear tousling, patting, training with treats, but quick to dart away if he detects conflict or correction coming. Gentle mouth, quiet. Some hesitation coming through doors or clipping up with to a leash. Once on the leash, he is light and easier handle than larger sibs. Ricky was an owner surrender to the San Jose Shelter. They had too many dogs at their home. We know he lived with 4



other Siberians. Ricky is not a digger. He is young, very curious, quick to slip out to explore the world, and can be mischievous, but he has done well in our house and small fenced yard with long daily walks. A settled environment, steady companionship, interactive time with people or dogs, and a regular diet will be good for him.

Think about our rescue and think about trying to foster that one siberian a year. OR Offer to pick up and take to a boarding kennel to adoption fairs. OR Schedule to work at a specific adoption fair OR Call and talk to one of us to see where you can help

VACCINE CLINIC
