4th of July tips - Be SAFE

1. Make sure your dog gets plenty of exercise earlier in the day.
2. Keep your dogs inside during fireworks, preferably with human companionship. If it's hot, air conditioning will help. Bringing your dogs to a fireworks display is never a good idea.
3. Provide a safe place inside for your dogs to retreat. When scared of sounds they can't orient, dogs often prefer small enclosed areas. (I once had a dog who climbed in the bathtub during windstorms.) If your dog is comfortable in a crate, that is a good option.
4. If possible, keep the windows and curtains closed.
5. Make sure all your dogs are wearing ID tags with a properly fitting collar. (Dogs have been known to become Houdini around the 4th of July.)
6. Leave your dog something fun to do – like a frozen [Kong](#) filled with his favorite treats.

Banana Dog Treats

These are sweet treats so use sparingly. Banana dog treats should be refrigerated OR placed in zip lock bags and remove a few at a time for daily use.

3 cups rolled oats (don't use quick [cooking](#) oatmeal)

1 1/4 cups all-purpose flour

2 eggs

1/4 cup vegetable oil

1/2 cup honey

1/2 milk

2 bananas, mashed

Instructions

Preheat Oven to 325 degrees

Grease a 9.5 x 14 baking pan

Combine oil, honey, milk, eggs and bananas in a large bowl and mix well. Add dry ingredients in 3 intervals mixing lightly each time to incorporate.

Spread mixture in pan and bake for about 25 minutes. Allow to cool and cut into 2" squares.

Quilting for Fall Furry Flurry....

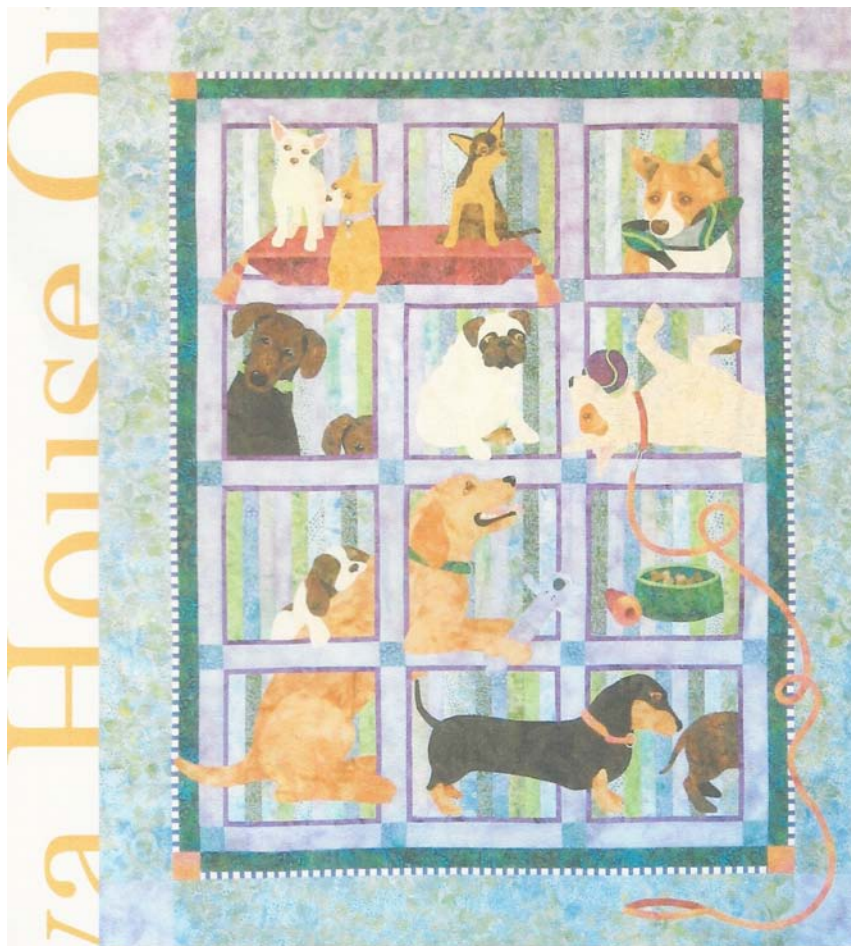
There are a number of us in BASH that enjoy and relax with sewing. Making booties, bandanas or quilts for raffles and ourselves.

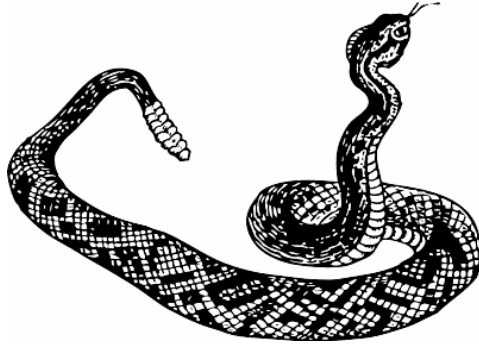

Umunhum Run and Camping

July 30, 31

In previous years I was able to set a schedule for the summer. This year we have been unable to run as much because they have been demolishing buildings on the old base. It has been too dangerous to be there so we have waited to set the runs. This is TENTATIVE...can change from weather, Fire or schedules that cause us to change the date.



We have a MULE now for carting and bathroom runs. This will be the first camping trip of the summer. We have to pull out all the stuff we put away for the winter (BBQ, tables, etc)

We meet around 5 pm on Saturday night and if the weather allows, we run the dogs between 7 and 9 pm. If it is warm we eat dinner first and then run them. They run from 1 mile to 7 miles, again it is based on the weather... Dinner is a

group effort.

Some people then camp in tents but most campout in their cars or beside them.

In the morning we rise with the sun and run the dogs again. We try different dogs in different positions and come back to a GREAT group breakfast and off the hill by 11 am.... You still have time to do things before the end of the weekend.

Most people go up for the whole event. SOMETIMES (not all the time) we have a couple that only come up for the evening part. This can only happen if we have at least two cars going down at the same time.

Time to meet- 5 pm at the lowest gate (there are three locked gates so we have to stay together)

What you need to bring- your own drinks, sleeping bag, food for your dog and food for dinner and or breakfast

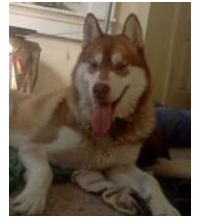
