

Your dog is individually trained to respond with aversion to the scent, sound and sight of rattlesnakes to avoid being bitten by one. Training is conducted in a controlled environment ensuring the safety of your dog as well as the safety of the muzzled rattlesnakes used in the training.

This fun match is for all, not just those that do confirmation. You don't have to know what to do either. This is a match for those that show to practice and the rest of us just to have fun with our dogs.

For those that have AKC registered Siberian Huskies, Alaskan Malamutes and Samoyeds, they will enter confirmation.

All of those that look purebred Siberian, Malamute or Samoyed that have been rescued or acquired without papers but have been altered, can enter Confirmation Spay/neuter for that breed.

All of those that have taken our wonderful mixes....enter Sled Dog- Sib, Sammy, Mal, and all those in between will enter Sled Dog.


There are classes for puppies, adults, veterans and champions. We will be happy to help you with which to enter.

There are two obedience classes – on is Husky Charm (basic strategies for training a northern breed and Husky Disobedience – class to talk about and learn techniques for "problems"

You can try Rally with your dog- no experience required. You can also try Urban carting with your dog or you can try it yourself.

You don't have to know what you are doing, nor does your dog. This is an event that is meant to be fun and expose all of us to having more fun.

Mark your calendars for this day...it is a great event and fun for the whole family especially the dogs and kids.



Traveling North on I-680, exit at Stone Valley East and turn right at the stop sign. The park will be on your right hand side about 1.5 miles down the road.

Traveling South on I-680, take the Stone Valley Road EAST exit. The park will be on your right hand side about 1.5 miles down the road.

Oak Hill Park is located next to Monte Vista High School. You may park in the school parking lot.

We hope to see many at this fun day.



**Come one, come all, for the dogs, dogs, dogs!** There will be show dogs, rescue dogs, puppies, veteran dogs and all sorts of sled dogs – **Malamutes, Huskies, Samoyeds**, and **mixes** of these breeds.

A fun match is just that – an opportunity to have fun with your dog, with other people who love dogs and enjoy some great outdoor fun. You don't have to know what you are doing either! There will be judging like you see on Animal Planet's breed competitions. If you have never tried this but want to, this is the place to give it a whirl. The Judge or ring steward will help you with what you need to do.

AKC registered dogs will be judged in formal **conformation** classes, all the other dogs will be in the spay/neuter confirmation of that breed, or the more general "Sled Dog" class. Classes will be held for **puppies**, adults and veterans.

If your dog likes to pull or you want to see how they do there will dog carts there that your dog might be able to try.

There will be a demonstration of Rally and you can participate and see how your dog likes it. You go around a planned trail and there will be instructions about what you need to do with your dog (sit, go around cones, jump a little pole etc) it is great fun.

There are two obedience classes. – one for general tips on training a northern breed dog (they are unique) and one for people that have been training and have come up against some problems that they want a little more help on.

There is a great raffle, silent auction (items benefit the rescue that brought them), harnesses and collars for sale, a special FUN MATCH shirt and more.

This is TENTATIVE...can change from weather or schedules that cause us to change the date. They are all nearest the full moon that would could get. June's is a lunar eclipse.



We meet around 5 pm on Saturday night and if the weather allows, we run the dogs between 7 and 9 pm. If it is warm we eat dinner first and then run them. They run from 1 mile to 7 miles, again it is based on the weather... Dinner is a group effort.

Some people then camp in tents but most campout in their cars or beside them.

In the morning we rise with the sun and run the dogs again. We try different dogs in different positions and come back to a GREAT group breakfast and off the hill by 11 am.... You still have time to do things before the end of the weekend.

Most people go up for the whole event. SOMETIMES (not all the time) we have a couple that only come up for the evening part. This can only happen if we have at least two cars going down at the same time.

Time to meet- 5 pm at the lowest gate (there are three locked gates so we have to stay together) (an hour earlier)
