Ever fantasized about running the Iditarod behind your own 16-dog team? Thought about how you would find the trail when you are out there in the wilderness by yourself? Worried about how you would go to the bathroom? Karen Ramstead, the first Canadian woman to complete the Iditarod, will be talking about her personal experiences in running this race multiple times. She will talk about training, showing and more.

Karen owns North Wapiti Kennels in Alberta, Canada, where she breeds and trains her dogs. They are beautiful purebred Siberians, hence the name "pretty sled dogs". We will stroll through her kennels pictorially, and meet many of her dogs. We will hear about the mischief they get into, as well as their love of running. Many of her racing dogs are champion show dogs also.

She will have a fantastic slide show with pictures taken during and after the running of the race which show the teams running along flawlessly while the musher stands on the runners looking at ease. She will tell us the true story. Ever try to park a 16-dog sled team next to multiple other 16-dog sled teams? For those of us who have problems parking the family car, this sounds very daunting!

Umunhum Run and Camping

June 25, 26

In previous years I was able to set a schedule for the summer. This year we have been unable to run as much because they have been demolishing buildings on the old base. It has been too dangerous to be there so we have waited to set the runs. This is TENTATIVE...can change from weather, Fire or schedules that cause us to change the date.



We have a MULE now for carting and bathroom runs. This will be the first camping trip of the summer. We have to pull out all the stuff we put away for the winter (BBQ, tables, etc)

We meet around 5 pm on Saturday night and if the weather allows, we run the dogs between 7 and 9 pm. If it is warm we eat dinner first and then run them. They run from 1 mile to 7 miles, again it is based on the weather... Dinner is a

group effort.

Some people then camp in tents but most campout in their cars or beside them.

In the morning we rise with the sun and run the dogs again. We try different dogs in different positions and come back to a GREAT group breakfast and off the hill by 11 am.... You still have time to do things before the end of the weekend.

Most people go up for the whole event. SOMETIMES (not all the time) we have a couple that only come up for the evening part. This can only happen if we have at least two cars going down at the same time.

Time to meet- 5 pm at the lowest gate (there are three locked gates so we have to stay together)

What you need to bring- your own drinks, sleeping bag, food for your dog and food for dinner and or breakfast

2 cups low salt beef or chicken broth

Small rawhide sticks

Mix water with beef or chicken broth and pour into ice cube trays. Place in freezer and serve cold. Add a [rawhide stick](#) halfway through the freezing. This recipe is quick, easy, and fun. It's probably best to serve this dish outside.

2 cups [vanilla yogurt](#) (or plain low-fat)

Mashed bananas

2 tablespoons honey

Mix ingredients and freeze in ice cube tray. Voila...sweet, cool bite-size treats for your pooch!

Frosty Paws Ice Cream and Birthday Cake

32 oz. plain yogurt

1 mashed banana

2 T p'nut butter

2 T honey

It's true dairy products aren't good for dogs, but yogurt contains much less lactase than regular [milk](#) and the live cultures are great for your dog's digestive system. This dog ice cream recipe is delicious and good for your pet!

1. Mix all these ingredients in your blender, then dump into ice cube trays, paper cups, or even a kong toy to freeze and serve.

2. If you want to go all out for your mutt you can freeze these homemade frosty paws just like you would homemade ice cream. A salt-less automatic ice cream maker makes this as easy as using any other appliance in your home and the frosty paws will be ready to serve in 10 minutes.

For the ultimate treat, appropriate for desert at a doggy birthday party, follow steps one and two, then take the mostly frozen dog ice cream product of number two and spread it 1" to 1½" thick on wax paper. Freeze for five minutes and then remove dog ice cream from freezer. Next, use a paw shaped cookie cutter to cut a paw shaped "frosty paws", remove ice cream around edges, and return paw shapes to the freezer to freeze solid.

NOTE: This can also be made with baby meat instead of the fruit and peanut butter.

Doggie Dessert recipe

4 cups rice milk

1 tablespoon vanilla extract

1 tablespoon honey or peanut butter

Set paper [cupcake](#) liners into a muffin tin. In a large bowl, stir together all ingredients. Use a cup with a spout to pour the mixture into the muffin cups. Freeze.

To serve, remove paper liner and place treat in dog or cat bowl.

For a double treat, place a miniature dog [biscuit](#) in the filled muffin tin before freezing.

Sled Dog- Sib, Sammy, Mal, and all those in between can enter Sled Dog. All of those that have taken our wonderful mixes....enter Sled Dog

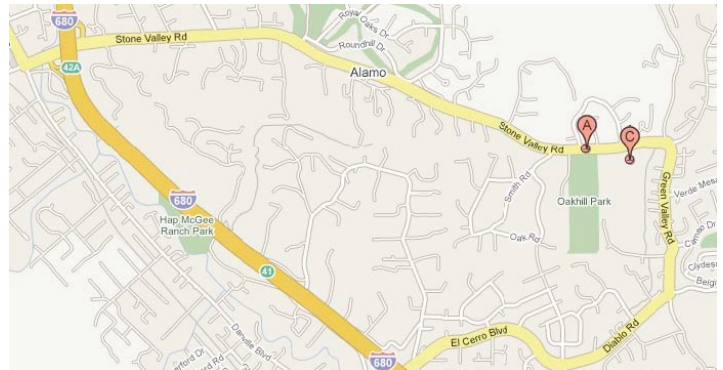
There are classes for puppies, adults, veterans and champions. We will be happy to help you with which to enter..

It is located next to Monte Vista High School and you may park in the school parking lot.



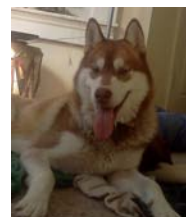

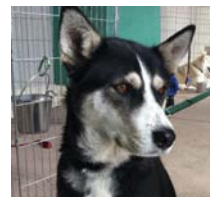

He is very gentle and loves to chew on nylon bones along with playing tug a war with ropes. He knows how to sit, gives his paw and lay down. Chinook loves going for rides, and chases birds in our yard. He needs a family with husky experience or one that wants to work with an intelligent siberian.

Leo is a beautiful black and white woolly Siberian husky. Although someone destroyed his pride by shaving him, his leonine coat will soon grow back restoring him to his former glory. His eyes are a beautiful ice blue. He is most likely 3 to 4 years old and weighs 50 pounds. He is crate trained and house broken. He has some basic obedience training and will sit and shake paws even without treats. Leo does pull when starting out on a walk and needs more work in this area. A front clip harness would be helpful. Leo is under socialize with other dogs. He is not aggressive but does not know how to play. At the moment a friend's 18 month husky is giving him lessons and he is rapidly improving, with a big doggy smile on his face. He has meet small dogs and children while on walks and appears to be fine with both. I do not know how he is with cats. He does guard his food bowl, but gives up toys and chew bones readily. He is also a counter-surfer. He will keep you kitchen neat and tidy as you will learn to put everything away and out of his reach. He does not appear to be a door darter but was picked up by the dog catcher in February as a stray. I am not sure if he escaped or if it was neglect on his owners part. From the condition of his coat and the fact that his owner surrendered him two weeks ago I am trusting in the later.
