All of those that look purebred Siberian, Malamute or Samoyed that have been rescued or acquired without papers but have been altered, can enter Conformation Spay/neuter for that breed.

Sled Dog- Sib, Sammy, Mal, and all those in between can enter Sled Dog. All of those that have taken our wonderful mixes....enter Sled Dog

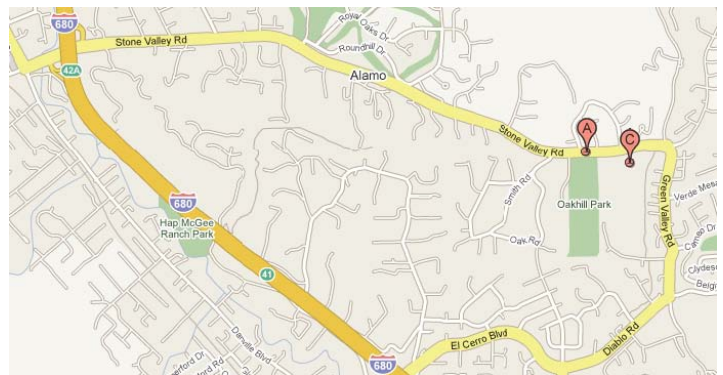
There are classes for puppies, adults, veterans and champions. We will be happy to help you with which to enter..

Facebook

I have never been a big person on all of the social media things...they change so much and so much to keep up with when you have to work and do other things. In the past year I have began to use Facebook for rescue at both the local and national level. I have found that used wisely it is invaluable for rescue.

Almost 2 months ago there was an 8 year old Siberian at the San Jose Shelter. We had no place to put him. We could board him but was that fair? Not knowing which if any foster home would take on an older dog. I posted to facebook and had a number of people interested in him. I said we would help place, we just didn't have a foster home. You have to be a member of BASH to foster..... A wonderful lady said she would take him. I picked him pup the next day and took Lobo to her. He was older and overweight...but very nice. She has since decided he has fit in well and she is going to keep him.



Two weeks ago Norsled and BASH were contacted about a dog that had a horrible wound on his side at the Sacramento Shelter. Neither of us as individual groups could do much but together we did. It ended up the dog had had acid thrown on his side. With a few facebook posts, sharing etc... Norsled was able to raise over \$8,000 which paid for the surgeries to close his side. He is now recovering and will soon be available for adoption



Yesterday I reposted an older dog that needed a place to go. Had to try but didn't know if it would help and it did. Three people were interested in fostering this old girl who's owner had died. All from various people sharing the post.

Why do I write about this. It is important for all that work with rescues, support rescues etc....to share what you see about our rescues with others. It is amazing what that one share will bring to a dog that needs a foster home or a new forever home. A click of the entry and it can go around the world. We try not to put out everything, but those that have a special place in our hearts....and it is working..

Paw Print Day

Imprint your best friend's paw print in clay and see it transformed onto an ornament, a picture frame or stepping stone complete with some nice phrase or just their name. This is a great way of remembering them when it is their time to cross the rainbow bridge.

Randee has graciously volunteer her office space for the event! They asked us to give them 3 days and we can work on it from there. The days we are thinking about are Friday June 20, Saturday June 21...but not set yet.... New info- appointment times still available...

The price includes the imprinting, the plaque, and the custom work. There's no other fee except for taxes. The plaque choices for kids are similar to the dog prints. The options for writing, colors and border are the same, it is only a price difference due to a kid handprint being bigger than dog print.

We do take Amex, Visa and Mastercard! However, at the site we won't have a credit card machine so we'll be writing down the credit card information then mail the receipt to each person. Keep in mind that the prices below don't already include taxes.

We do accept checks, you can just make them to Create It Ceramics.

For the picture frames, you don't have to bring in the picture. Picture frames are usually for single wallet size pictures and you just tape them to the back of the plaque.

When your plaques are painted and ready for pick up we will give you a call and you can pick them up at our location in Town and Country in Palo Alto, CA. We normally do not ship handprints because of their fragile nature. However, if some of your guest need them shipped we can get a quote from our local UPS and call your guest for a shipping address and charge. You can also pick up all the pieces together, just remember to tell everyone that it got picked up.

The artist would come with all the gear and you would press their paws in to the mold. So if your dogs does not like their paws touched now is the time to get them use to being touched.

PLEASE come prepared with your choice of words and have some backup in case your phrase is too long

We will be working with Maddie's Fund again this year on May 31st June 1st at Pet Food Express on Almaden Expressway.

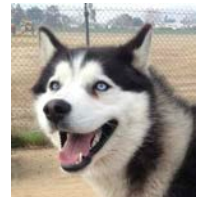

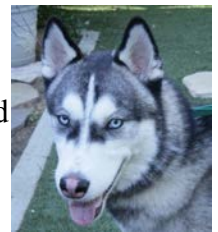

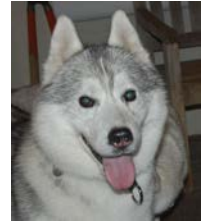

Observations:

Looks to be a Border Collie/Alaskan Malamute mix. Could be Sibe rather than Mal but at this time I will go with Mal.

Little on the thin side, ate well but was easily distracted, wanted to see everybody else's food bowls. Did not show any food protective behavior and though really interested in treats he was not aggressive about it.

Might be okay with cats, showed little interest in the neighbor's cat but further checking is needed.

The long coat gives an impression of a much larger dog.

The activity level on this guy is pretty high.

He believes leather shoes and gloves are play toys but not towels, rags or clothing.

This combined with the activity level could be why he ended up in the shelter.

Uses his mouth in play but seems totally aware of pressure and though robust it was not excessive.

Generally delightful and happy disposition.
