Husky Hikes in June

The First Hike will be Sunday June 3rd at Gavin/ Dry Creek Park in Union City. Please arrive by 8 am for beverages and snacks. We will be starting the hike by 8:30 sharp. We will be meeting at the May Road park entrance near the Dry Creek Apartment complex. This is a small parking lot so the earlier you arrive the better. It may fill up by 8 am. We will walk the High Ridge Loop Trail to Jordan Pond. There is a picnic area there where we can take a break, water the dogs and have a snack. We will then return on the Dry Creek Trail. Please look up the Park on EBparks.org for a trail map. And also to look at the other trails if you wish to continue hiking on your own after we return to the parking lot. There are a lot of beautiful trails in this park.

This second hike is scheduled for June 24th meet up at 8 am leaving at 8:30. We will meet at Shady Oakes Park in South San Jose, street parking along the park. We will walk the Coyote Creek Trail to Hellyer Park. About 1 and 1/2 miles. Once there we can make a loop around Cottonwood lake and picnic area, taking a break before we head back. There is a great playground near the lake and a dog park further into the park. Coyote Creek is a paved trail so this is a good hike for anyone with small children still in strollers. I am planning to bring a dog powered little red wagon. Please look up a map of the park at sccgov.org. We will then return to Shady Oaks Parks. Although the trail is shaded it may be hot by the time we head back, so please bring water for your dogs and yourself.
