Road Trip with the Champ

When we were at Tamarack for SnoBASH I, BASH was invited to participate in the Winter Explosion at Mt. Reba, the downhill ski area of Bear Valley. They wanted us to give a demonstration of dog sledding. We weren't quite



sure what to expect, but we agreed. So on Feb. 17th we set off bright and early in the morning. There were 3 adults (me, Randee, and Peggy) and 7 dogs packed into Randee's Jeep. The dogs we chose were the puppies (Ralfee and Frankee), the three Stooges (Quinn, Trekk, and Madee), and the Flying Nun (Kobee). We threw Foxyy in for good measure.

We packed carefully so the Jeep was full but not obnoxiously so. Ralfee, Frankee, Trekk, and Foxyy were in the back, and were very good the whole trip. Kobee, Madee, and Quinn were in the back seat with Peggy. Before we had even made it out of San Jose, Quinn was standing with his front feet on the console, giving me "the look". (I was the front seat passenger.) I thought, "Oh, how cute. He wants to be friendly." That naïve thought didn't last too long, though. Very soon I realized that what he was really saying was, "What is that lowly commoner doing in my seat?" When I didn't move as he apparently expected, he decided the only option was to join me. So abruptly he jumped into my lap, tail swishing across my face in the process. (I got to know his rear end up close and personal during this trip!) He maneuvered around for a while, then settled down with his chin on the dash, his body draped over one of my legs, with a paw hanging down on either side. That lasted a few seconds, then he shifted his face so his nose was wedged between the dash and the window. (Apparently he likes the fresh, cool air.) Then his head slowly slid off, down onto my leg, and then down on further. Suddenly I realized that he had caught the scent of the snacks I had in the bag under my legs. After I wrestled his head out of that, I shoved him back into the back seat. This was the pattern for the rest of the trip. Up on my lap, tail in my face, twist and turn to get comfortable, face on dash, face on window, licking window, lurch around, back into the back seat. (Randee said that he was usually "restless" on the way somewhere, but was much calmer on the trip home. Do NOT believe her! He was the same way all the way home.) Randee tried putting her arm across to my seat back, and that worked for a second or two, until he discovered he could easily go under the arm. Eventually we tried opening the console so that the top would block him from jumping into the front seat. That worked for a while, but eventually one of us would forget to keep it propped open with an elbow, and up he'd come. Madee got curious after a while, so she hopped onto the console (her butt and all four feet fit on, she is so little!!) but soon Quinn decided it was time to go back into the back seat and just turned around and jumped, knocking her off

on her tush. Intermittently Peggy would grab his leash and restrain his head resting on the console (tongue out, of course). But the instant our attention was elsewhere he crept slowly up and then jumped back into my lap. By the end of our trip, my pristine red fleece looked like another dog. It also got pretty exciting when we got onto the narrow, windy mountain roads with him standing on my lap, because then Randee couldn't see out that window or see the mirror on that side of the car, and would ask me what was over there! That was a bit unnerving when there was nothing there but the edge of a mountain, and we were trying to wrestle him into the back seat! Needless to say, we made the trip safely and had a good time giving rides in the hot sun at the foot of the ski mountain. And in Quinn's defense, I have to say I don't think his head has recently gotten big because he is now a champion... I think he has already had a high opinion of himself!!

SnoBASH 2007 – April 21-22

We will be holding the event at Bear Valley Cross Country. Most years we give rides to Disabled adults on one of the two days. We don't know which day yet, nor if we are for sure doing it.



Rooms at Tamarack Lodge go quickly. BASH reserves the entire lodge. Dogs are not allowed in the rooms. All of our dogs stay in our vehicles at night. They offer a continental breakfast each morning or those staying at the lodge. Rooms are for 2 nights. The last few days you can get them for one night. The main lodge has rooms that are dorm style

(bathrooms and shoer down the hall). These rooms for two nights range from \$190 to \$210 (two adults per room) All rooms sleep two and some sleep more. Extra people in a room are charged \$10 per night. There are two barn rooms that sleep up to 8. They each have kitchens and a separate bedroom area. They are \$370 + per room (works out better than two rooms).
