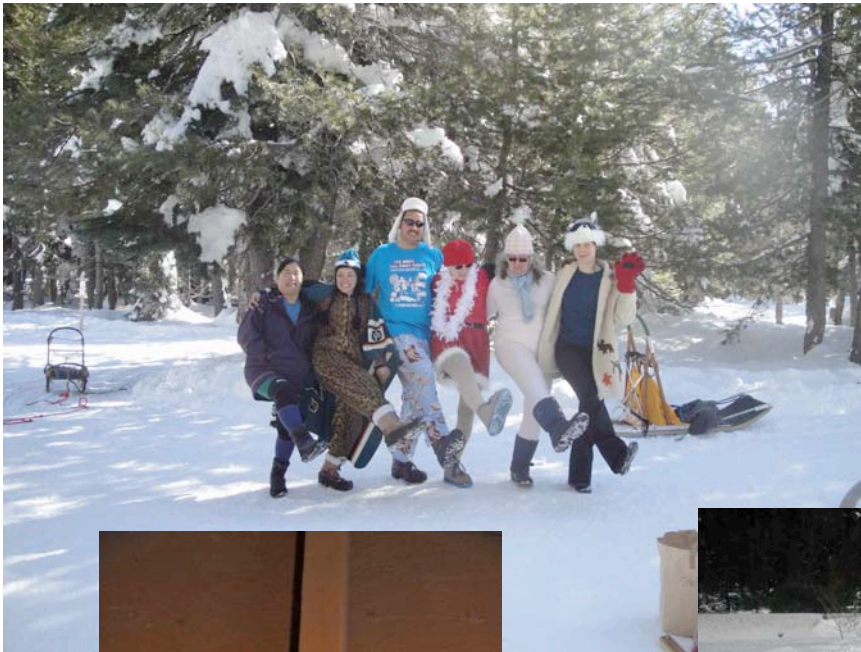


SnoBASH 2010

President- runs the meetings and is a signer on the checkbook.

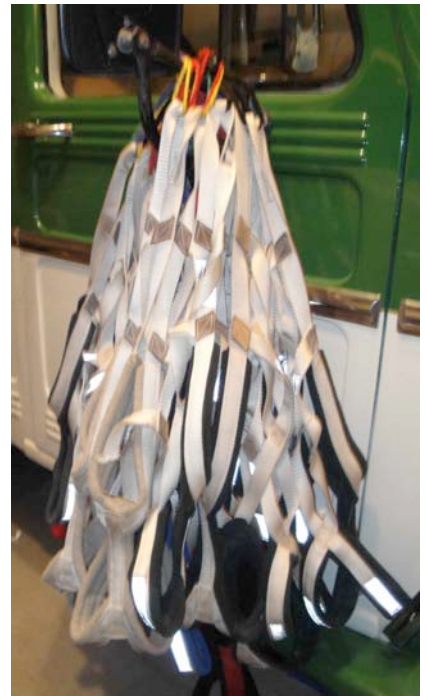
Secretary- writes the minutes for the meetings and distributes the agenda

Low-Fat Dog Biscuit Recipe

Ingredients:

½ cup margarine
½ cup low sodium beef, chicken or veggie broth
½ cup dry (powdered) milk
½ tsp salt
2 tsp sugar
1 large egg
3 cups whole-wheat flour

Directions:

- Combine all of the ingredients except the flour in a large bowl and mix well.
- Mix in the flour ½ cup at a time. Mix well until a dough ball forms.
- Take the dough ball and knead a few times.
- Use rolling pin, and roll out dough to about ¼" thickness.
- If you have a cookie cutter in the shape of a dog bone – great! But any shape will do (dogs won't care) and if you don't have a cookie cutter, you can use a knife to cut the dough into any size that you want.
- Spray the cookie sheet with Pam or another type of cooking spray — don't load it on — just a nice light quick spray.
- Bake in preheated oven at 325 degrees for 50 to 55 minutes. Then turn the oven off, but leave the dog biscuits in the oven for another couple of hours. This will help dry the biscuits out and make them crunchy!

Substitutions:

- I have substituted olive oil for margarine with ok results. Measure out the amount and add it gradually until the dough comes together.
- If you don't have whole wheat flour, you can use white flour. And, if you are cleaning out the cupboards, you could mix any combo of white, wheat, or rye flours. Just leave out the corn meal (allergies and digestion issues).
- Bisquick or prepared packaged biscuits or pancake mixes WILL NOT WORK.
- You can always make these even more healthy by using organic!

Chester Winterfest Dog Sled Race Feb 21, 22

It had been a few years since a couple of us had gone to a sled race and the first time for a few others. 9 BASH members attended the race. 6 went to race and 3 were officials.

The weather going into the weekend had been questionable. We kept hearing there was plenty of snow. On the drive in it appeared there was not enough snow. We arrived at the race site and it appeared they were their own microclimate. There was a great trail with 3 feet plus of snow. It was a little mushy on top from the heat but it was fine and safe to sled on.

This is a sprint and mid distance race. The mid-distance has 6 dog teams that run anywhere from 10 miles to 50 miles. The distance depends on how long of a trail they can put in. The sprint races are 8 dog (8 miles) 6 dog (6 miles) 4 dog (4 miles) 3 dog (3 miles). The 3 dog race is not sanctioned by ISDRA (International Sled Dog Racing Association) so they can set their own rules. In this case they have a category called “Independent” Driver. The same 3 dogs are used both days, but you can have two different drivers. This allows so many of us that share dogs for sledding both get a chance to each drive the team.

Race day one starts at 7:30 with a Drivers meeting. You are told how the trail has been put in, what to expect, what corners there are and any other information that is needed for safety. The weather was cool but nice. As the day warmed up, the trail got a little mushy but was nice.

Hugo Antonucci races the 6 dog race. He wasn't feeling great and asked Megan McQueen if she would drive his team. She did and the dogs did great. They ended up in 5th place.



The rest of the group that went, entered the 3 dog race. David and Michelle shared 3 of their dogs, Megan and Peggy share three and Marie ran 3 of hers. Everyone had fun and a great experience racing. Dave and Michelle got 2nd, Marie 4th and Peggy and Megan 6th.

Day two started out a little different. Overnight we received about a foot and a half of snow that we need to clear off the cars. The trails had 2+ feet of snow so they were only able to put back in 2 of the 5 trails from the day before. The 6 Mid, 8 and 6 dogs all raced on the 6 dog trail, the 4, 3, junior and skijoring raced on the 3 dog trail.

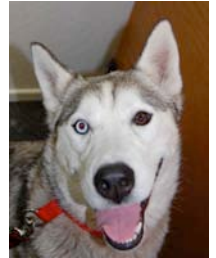

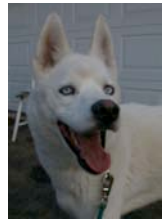
