Northern California Sled Dog Rescue Ice Cream Social and Family Fun Day



April 10 Husky Hike

Sunday dawned cool, grey, and drizzly, a sharp contrast and relief to the previous week's unseasonably warm sunny weather. About eight, we headed out with Kai and Coco reclining comfortably in the back seat of Dennis' new extended cab truck – across Dumbarton and up 101 to westbound highway 84 route to northbound 280, and then off ramping back down east on Farm Hill Blvd. to Stulsaft Park.

About 9:00, just as we were setting up coffee thermoses on the tailgate, Patty and Gail drove up with four more dogs, and then Candace arrived with her Stella. The drizzle had stopped, and for the rest of the day we had very pleasant conditions. Very few people were out, and no children in the wonderfully equipped play area.

We took the path down the right hand side of the play area fence, and released the dogs when we got down to the creek bridge, which marked the beginning of the 'unleashed' area. The dogs were delighted with their freedom, and pretty much progressed along the wide pathways like the fun and rowdy crowd of Siberians that they are. It was fun to watch their postering, chasing, dodging, bowing, and shoving matches as we moved along to the end of the unleash area, where we found a number of picnic tables and another restroom and water fountains (including one that releases water in bowl at ground level. We stopped for snacks, took some photos, and progressed around the rest of the figure eight path around the bridge. We were back up to Farm Hill Blvd. just before 12:00, had more snacks, visited, and then rolled off for the rest of our weekends.

This was well wooded terrain, Oak, Madrone, Bay, California Holly shrubs, and some wild flowers, with some poison oak popping up — most of it seems to have been removed. It is basically a ravine that has avoided all the other development around Redwood City, has been tamed a bit for convenience and safety, but otherwise makes you feel like you are far, far away, out of the city. Everyone agreed it was a really good thing they'd resisted the urge to sleep in, and that they'd like to come back regularly, particularly on hot summer days — the shade would be wonderful.

If we do this again, I'd suggest we start at the park entrance/staging area at Goodwin Avenue and Mitchell way, and park on residential streets. This entrance opens directly into the off leash area. If go on summer weekdays, note that the city has some nature day camps in the amphitheater bench area.



SNOBASH 2004

We were able to hold one snoBASH but not a second. We started doing the "spring" SnoBASH when we were asked to do rides for challenged adults. The people that owned Bear Valley at the time, brought up a load of adults on a bus for a weekend of experiences. It was some of the best times that I have had sledding. It was a great experience for all of us and to bring joy to those that would not normally experience dog sledding. I was going through some old pictures and pulled these up.... Us giving rides and just the very very happy faces of those that went for rides. I thought members would enjoy this.











Peanut Butter Dog Treats



Wrap up a bundle of homemade dog treats, flavored with yummy peanut butter, to gift to the dog lover in your life.

Ingredients

2 cups whole wheat flour
3/4 cup toasted wheat germ
1/4 cup brewers yeast
1/3 cup natural chunky peanut butter
1 large egg
3/4 cup low sodium chicken broth
3 tablespoons canola oil

Preparation

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350°F. Line a large shallow baking sheet with parchment paper.
- 2. Combine the flour, wheat germ and brewers yeast in a medium bowl. Whisk together the peanut butter, egg, broth and oil in a separate bowl. Pour the wet ingredients into the dry and stir with a spoon or rubber spatula until a rough dough forms. Knead the dough in the bowl 5-6 times until it comes together.
- 3. Turn the dough out onto a lightly floured work surface and roll to a 1/4-inch thickness. With a 3-inch dog bone shaped cookie cutter, cut out treats and transfer to the prepared baking sheet. Press all the scraps together, kneading once or twice, then roll out to 1/4-inch thickness and cut out more treats; repeat if necessary.
- 4. Bake treats until lightly browned and fairly hard, rotating the pans from top to bottom once, about 30-35 minutes. Remove from the oven and cool completely; biscuits will harden as they cool. Store in an airtight container.
