



Homemade Dog Treat Recipe Thanksgiving Treat

- 2 lbs. ground turkey
- 2 eggs
- 2 cups cooked rice
- 8 oz. peas
- 3 carrots, diced
- 1 apple, diced
- 2 cloves garlic, minced

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. In mixing bowl, combine all ingredients. Mix well by hand. On baking sheet, form into the shape of a large dog bone. Bake at 375 degrees for 45 minutes. Let cool and serve.

Homemade Dog Treat Recipe Turkey Treats

- 2 cups cooked turkey -- cut up
- 2 cloves garlic
- 4 teaspoons grated cheese
- 1 tablespoon parsley -- freshly chopped
- 2 egg
- 2 cups whole wheat flour
- 2 tablespoons brewer's yeast
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil

Combine turkey, garlic, cheese, parsley and mix well. Beat the eggs in a bowl and pour over turkey mixture. Add the flour, yeast, and oil. Stir until thoroughly mixed and all ingredients are coated. Drop into small lumps onto ungreased cookie sheet. Cook in a 350 degree oven for about 20 minutes, until brown and firm. Store in refrigerator.

Homemade Dog Treat Recipe Nutty Bones

1 3/4 cups flour

1/4 cup sesame seeds

1/2 cup brown sugar

12 tbs. butter

1/2 cup ground walnuts

1 egg yolk

1/2 cup vanilla extract

2 tbs. toasted wheat germ

Combine ingredients, knead until thoroughly blended. Roll out till 1/2" thick. Cut into shapes or just squares. Bake at 375F on ungreased cookie sheet for 12-15minutes. Cool. Store in airtight container. Keeps 2 weeks.




him really like him and say he is a typical 18 month old male siberian.
