Learn the Standard for a Siberian Husky October 12, 2013 4 pm Randee McQueen's house 906 Sweetbriar Dr. Campbell CA

Donna Beckman, author of Dog's Life Series, Siberian Husky and past president of the Siberian Husky Club of America, Siberian Judge present this talk on Siberian Huskies. She is also treasurer of the Northern California Siberian Husky Club. NCSHC does educational talks on Siberians and I offered my house for one so that BASH members had the opportunity to learn more.

As is often the case in the dog world, the best place to begin with advertising is with the Standard of the Breed.

A complete and accurate knowledge of the Standard for Siberian Huskies is absolutely necessary for selecting animals, exhibiting them well, and selecting photographs for publication. What are the correct proportions called for in the Standard? What are the Standard-fitting head characteristics? How is a Siberian supposed to move? You must know the answers to these questions, as well as be able to apply them to the dogs in front of you and in pictures. Why do all these characteristics make a difference in how they do their job.

For a the recreational social enthusiasts that we are, to learn what makes them be such a good sled dog, why their legs need to move a certain way etc....why is the length of leg make a difference. We will be able to equate this information all of our dogs, not just the pure bred Siberian. To be able to talk more accurately on our breed will only help everyone understand them more.

Following the talk will be a light dinner and more time to talk and ask questions.


