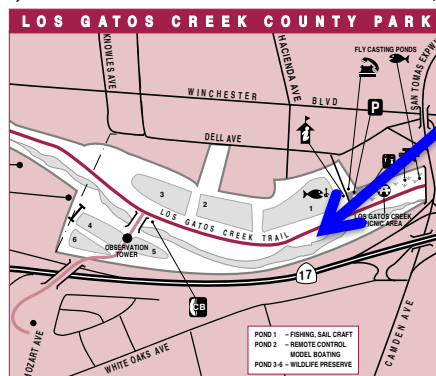

September Husky Hike, September 24 Don Edwards San Francisco Bay National Wildlife Refuge (East Bay)

Yesterday's trip out to the Lookout at Don Edwards San Francisco Bay Federal Wildlife Refuge was pleasant and refreshing, a nice ending to a frazzling week for us. Six of us met up at the Visitor Center picnic table for coffee and snacks – Bobby with Zulu, Veronique and David from Hayward with their white huskie Avalanche, and Lauren from U.C. with Zucari. Kai was incredibly pleased to meet up with such playful companions, after introductions and refreshments, and we proceeded around the trail with enthusiasm.



We planned this Husky Hike a couple weeks ago, during cooler weather, not expecting this to be the beginning of a record September heat wave in Northern California. Luckily, the early morning start time saved us from frying out on the sun-exposed trails, the air was still fresh, and

we'd all brought our sun glasses and hats. No bikes are allowed on this trail, but it is one of the very few trails at Edwards that allows dogs, and we are thankful for that!

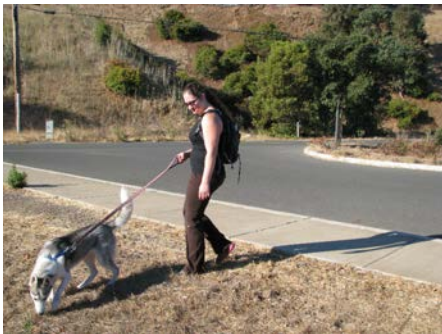
We headed south along Marshlands Road and crossed over to the Harrier Spur Trail for a brief view of one of the many sloughs, filling with high tide water. Then it was up to the Hilltop Overlook, a 500 foot climb to a panoramic overview of most of the bay from the southernmost Coyote Hill. The climb comes early in the walk, so it doesn't seem too strenuous for dogs or people.

There's a picnic table, viewing platform, and a little shade there if you'd like to linger and take in the views of the bay and the easterly Diablo Range and Mission Peak – sometimes there's are really brisk wind here, but this day it was very mild, the light was brilliant and the air was clear and not yet smoggy. This is one of my personal favorite places to take 'time out' anytime.

From the Outlook the Tidelands Trail heads down the ridge to where the upland meets marshland, and begins a big zig zag south along the marsh shore, past a tree and shady picnic bench, and then across Newark Slough on a wooden plank bridge to the actual bay waters shore line. There was a man in a kayak out in the slough! While we were crossing with a few somewhat hesitant dogs, three brawny men with red helmets cruised under in the Alameda County Sheriff Search and Rescue Boat. It's nice to know they're out there for us!



We then headed north along the now grey colored bay silt trail, one side a dike of grey mud, and the other all the varied colorful marsh vegetation along the slough. The old salt ponds stretch out at eye level for miles into the bay – they are currently dredging new ditches, building new trails and opening up the old dikes to let bay water reclaim the area for habitat marshes – a slow process, but eventually it will return to nature and expand a stopover for most species of west coast migrating birds.



Past the old duckblinds and interpretive signs, back across another wooden plank bridge over Newark Slough, past another picnic shelter (this one in an old boathouse) and finally to the Learning center where water, trash cans, and shady benches provided a comfortable place to rest a bit. Dennis and Bobby took off up the road to the Quarry Trail, to see what was happening at the old Quarry they are filling in next to

Coyote Hills Park proper, the rest of us headed back down Marshlands Road to our table in the shade for more refreshments (we had more snacks and cold drinks) where we lingered, talked about dogs, and generally relaxed in the shade for while. We headed home about noon; another pleasant interlude with our dogs.

We are presently planning another Husky Hike for October 9, early Sunday morning, location TBD. Hopefully, someplace in the shade!!
