Valentine's Day Dog Treat Recipe: Cranberry Hearts

Ingredients

- 2 free range eggs
- 1 and 1/2 cups almond flour
- 1 tablespoon coconut oil
- 3-4 tablespoons of coconut flour
- 1/2 cup dried cranberries

INSTRUCTIONS

- Preheat oven to 165°C.
- Beat 2 eggs and set aside.
- Combine your almond flour, coconut oil and dried cranberries together in a bowl.
- Once combined, pour in the eggs and mix together with your hands. The dough will be very wet.
- Begin adding in your coconut flour one TBSP at a time, mixing in each one

after added. You want to achieve a consistency that is easy to roll and not super sticky. This will require between 3-4 TBSP depending on your brand of flour and size of your eggs. The dough should easily form a ball.

- Rollout your dough and cut out the treats using bite-sized cookie cutters, [like these hearts](#) which are perfect for Valentine's Day (*Tip: Sprinkle a little coconut flour on top of your dough to keep it from sticking to the cookie cutters!*)
- Place your treats on a cookie sheet lined with parchment paper. Bake in the oven for 15-18 minutes or until crisp.
- Makes approx. 20 treats (dependant on size of cutter).

Valentines Day Pup Cakes Recipe



Ingredients

- [Puppy Cake Peanut Butter Cake Mix](#)
- [Dog Friendly Sprinkles](#)
- Peanut Butter (optional)
- [Cesar Cookie Crunchies](#) (I used the heart shapes)

Directions – How to Make Valentine’s Day Pup Cakes

Step One

Mix the Puppy Cake mix as stated in the directions on the box. (available through amazon and some pet stores)

Step Two

Pour mixture into your [heart shaped pan](#).

Step Three

Bake for 20-25 minutes at 350 degrees.

Step Four

Allow the pup cakes to cool before applying frosting and decorations.

Step Five

Frost your pup cakes using the frosting that came with the [Puppy Cake](#) mix or use peanut butter.

Step Six

Decorate the pup cakes using [Cookie Crunchie hearts](#) and/or [dog-friendly sprinkles](#).

We rescued a husky off the streets about a year ago. She is named Calypso which means one who hides. Multiple vets think she was on the streets for several months, she was emaciated and afraid of being inside, of all men, most women, and all loud noise or sudden movements. She had to be pulled out of a heap of garbage on some lady's side yard. We posted her on forums and checked at several vets, clinics, and shelters for a chip and lost notices and after about a month we registered her while we fostered her.



Calypso is spayed and now a healthy weight. She is now on Trazodone for anxiety. We have put her through group classes and private classes where she graduated from basic obedience training. She will follow basic commands such as sit, down, come, leave it, wait. She loves to play with the other dogs that we have in the house and loves to be outdoors, camping, and go on car rides. She walks well on a leash with minor corrections.

She is exceptionally quiet for a husky and will only have the occasional vocalization. She hasn't been introduced to other animals or children yet. She tends to hide in dark small spaces until she is comfortable in a new environment and likes to find shelter in a crate. She is a very loving dog once she gets comfortable with you and loves to cuddle with big sloppy kisses.
