Chicken and Rice Balls Recipe

Looking for a healthy snack for your pet? Try the Chicken and Rice Balls recipe. These treats are tasty and [full of good ingredients that dogs](#) enjoy.



Ingredients and Preparation

Here's what you'll need for these treats:

- 1 cup cooked, shredded chicken
- ½ cup cooked white or brown rice
- 1 egg
- ¼ cup grated carrots
- ¼ cup rolled oats
- 1 tablespoon coconut oil
- 1 teaspoon parsley

Start by heating your oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit. Mix the chicken, rice, and grated carrots in a big bowl. Add the oats and parsley. Mix them well.

Beat the egg in another bowl. Add it with coconut oil to your mixture. Stir until everything is mixed well.

Baking Instructions

Now, make small balls from the mix. Place them on a baking sheet with parchment paper. Bake them for 20-25 minutes. They should be firm and golden. Let them cool before you give them to your dog.

Storage Tips

Storing your chicken and rice balls right is key. They stay fresh in the fridge for up to 5 days. You can also freeze them for longer. **Proper homemade pet food storage** keeps them good for 3 months in the freezer. Use an airtight container to keep them dry and tasty.

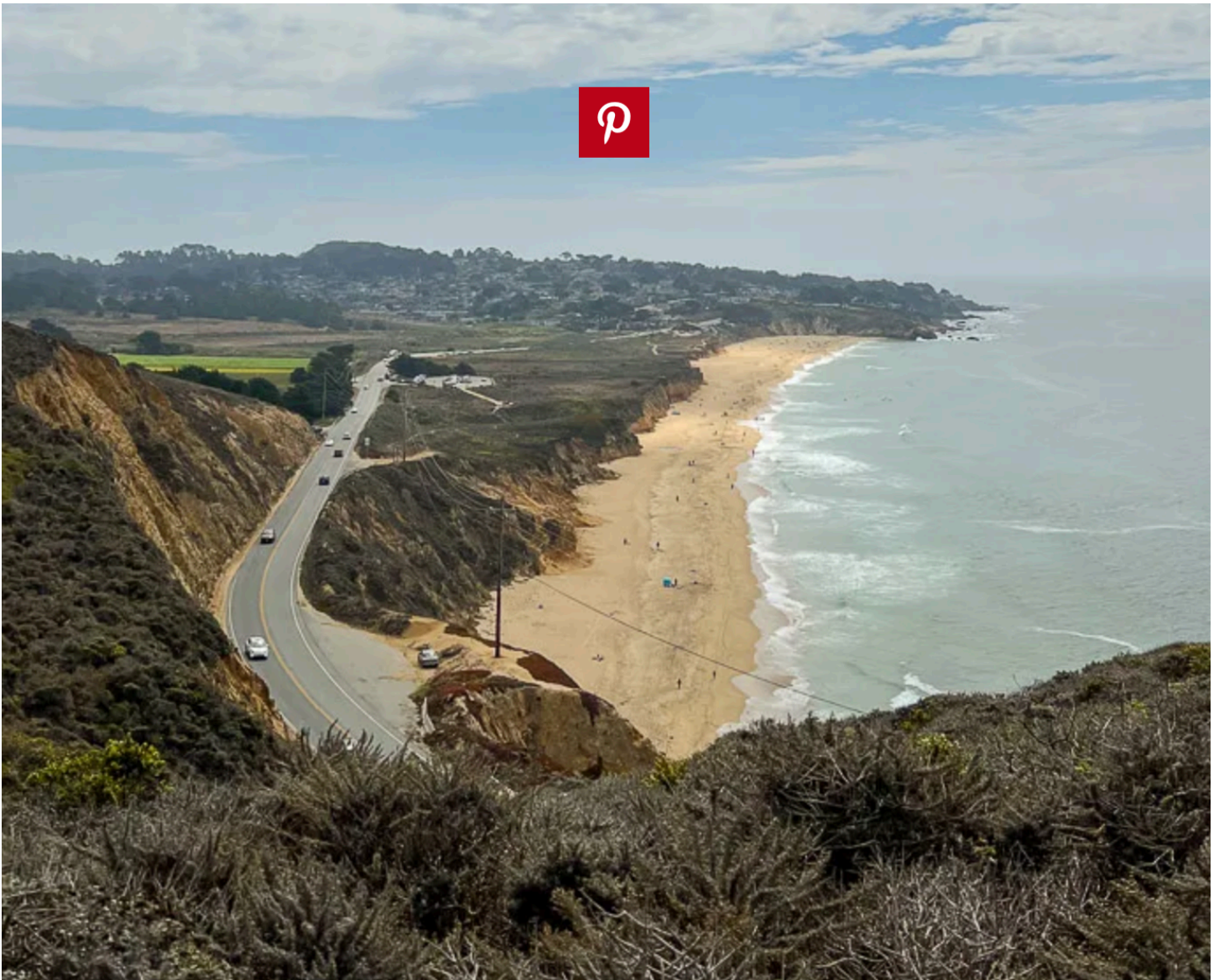
Place to Hike with your dog...

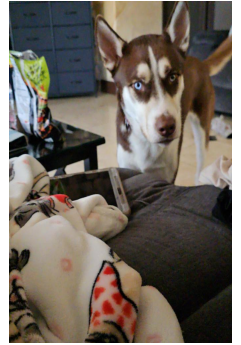

Rescue for May

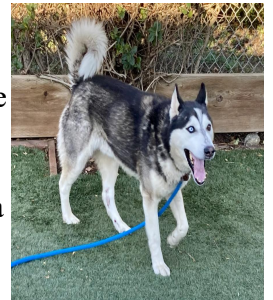

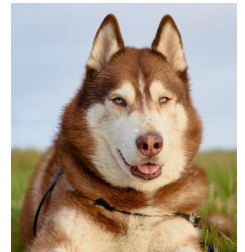
