

No Bake Coco-Nutter Pumpkin Balls

• **Prep Time:** 10 minutes

• Total Time: 1 hours 10 minutes

Yield: 32 cookies 1xCategory: Anytime Treat

Ingredients

- 1 cup pumpkin puree (mashed sweet potato or butternut squash works too)
- 1/2 cup unsweetened peanut butter (no xylitol!)
- 1 cup rolled oats
- 2 tbsp coconut oil
- 2 tbsp honey (maple syrup also works)
- 1/2 cup unsweetened dried coconut flakes

Instructions

- 1. Melt the coconut oil in a microwave or hob.
- 2. Line a baking tray or large dish with baking paper.
- 3. Place all ingredients (except dessicated coconut) into the food processor bowl and pulse to combine, pushing down the sides as necessary, until the dough starts to hold together.
- 4. Move dough to a plate or mixing bowl. With lightly oiled hands, divide the dough roughly into quarters. Each quarter should make about 8 biscuits, for a total of 32 cookies, or you can make smaller cookies for smaller dogs.
- 5. Roll each ball to a smooth and uniform shape, then place on parchment.
- 6. Place desiccated coconut into a clean bowl.
- 7. Roll each ball in a handful of coconut until evenly coated.
- 8. Place biscuits into a lined tupperware container, layering with more baking paper if necessary.


SNDD Mushing Clinic

In a shelter packed with dogs, it's not always easy to stand out from the crowd and get adopted but he was shelter staff favorite and is a certified good boy.

We rescued a husky off the streets about a year ago. She is named Calypso which means one who hides. Multiple vets think she was on the streets for several months, she was emaciated and afraid of being inside, of all men, most women, and all loud noise or sudden movements. She had to be pulled out of a heap of garbage on some lady's side yard. We posted her on forums and checked at several vets, clinics, and shelters for a chip and lost notices and after about a month we registered her while we fostered her.

Calypso is spayed and now a healthy weight. She is now on Trazodone for anxiety. We have put her through group classes and private classes where she graduated from basic obedience training. She will follow basic commands such as sit, down, come, leave it, wait. She loves to play with the other dogs that we have in the house and loves to be outdoors, camping, and go on car rides. She walks well on a leash with minor corrections.

She is exceptionally quiet for a husky and will only have the occasional vocalization. She hasn't been introduced to other animals or children yet. She tends to hide in dark small spaces until she is comfortable in a new environment and likes to find shelter in a crate. She is a very loving dog once she gets comfortable with you and loves to cuddle with big slobbery kisses.
